The standout of both discs has to be Mr. Please, which comes in 3 versions that all work the floor effectively. I'm into the Dance Vocal Mix for its strong vocal and structure, but the Club Dub (Pt. 1) is a strong runner up. The second must-have track is Knowledge Starvation on disc 2. This track will have the floor moving and singing along to its 'knowledge starvation' chorus, and the Spanish-spoken-word segment by Celo makes it even more memorable.
